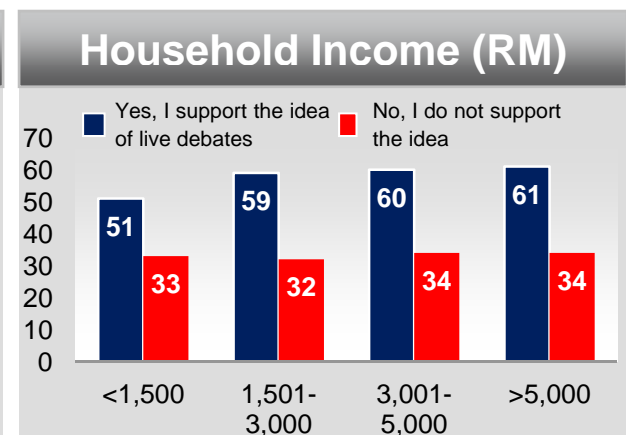
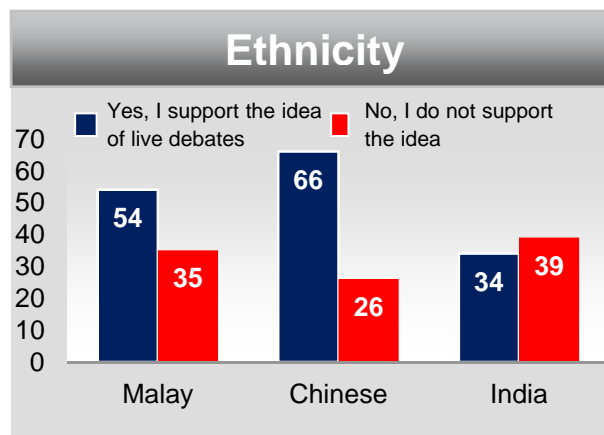
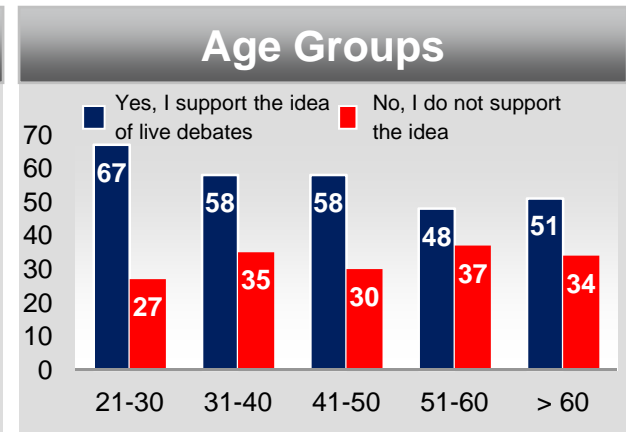
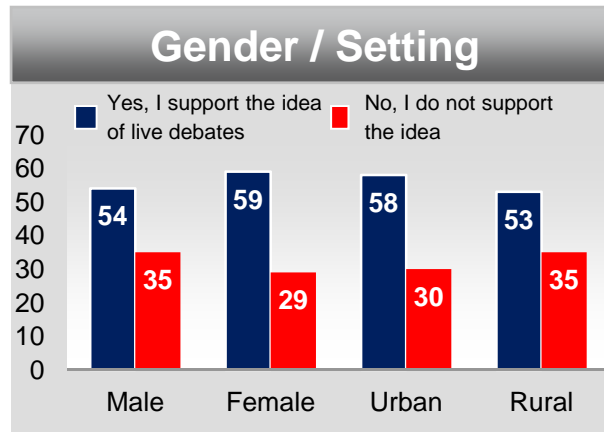
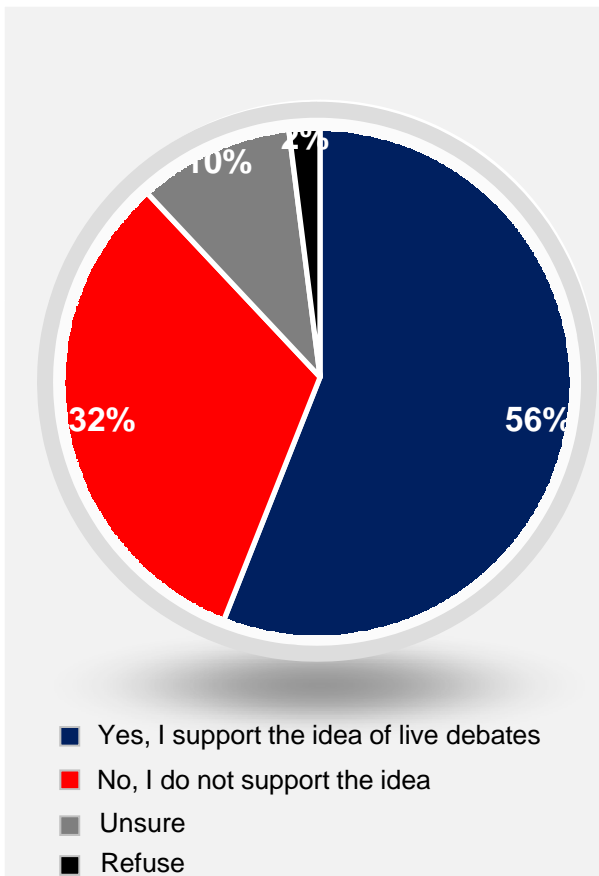
Methodology

- 1022 voters aged 21 and above were interviewed via telephone.
- The survey respondents in all states across Peninsular Malaysia
- Voters were selected through random stratified sampling method along the lines of ethnicity, gender, age and state.
- Survey margin of error estimated at $\pm 3.07\%$
- The survey was conducted between 10th February and 23rd February 2012.

Note: Total percentages presented may or may not add up to 100% due to rounding up of figures.

Leadership Debate

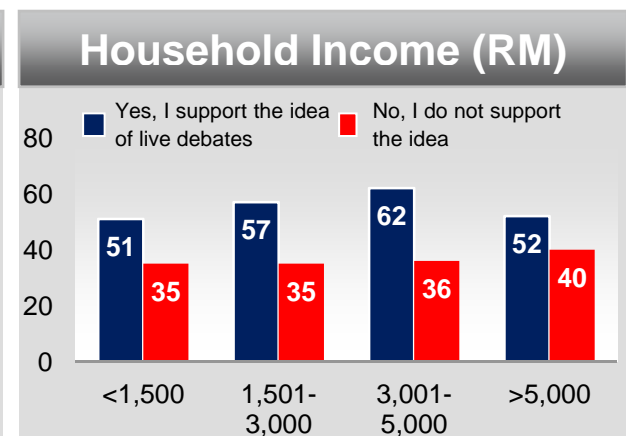
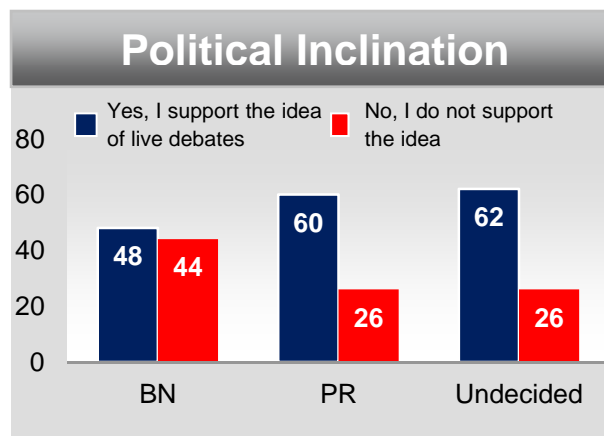
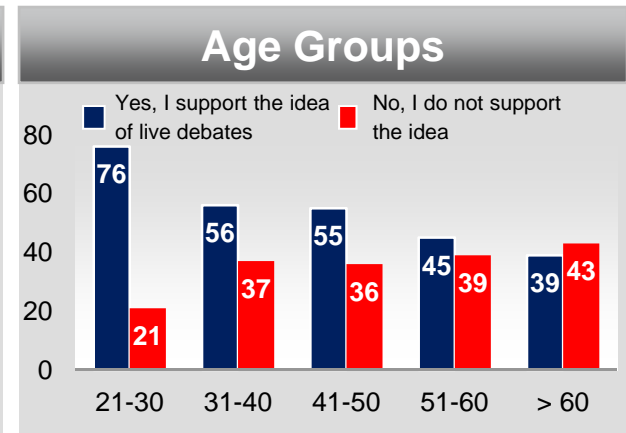
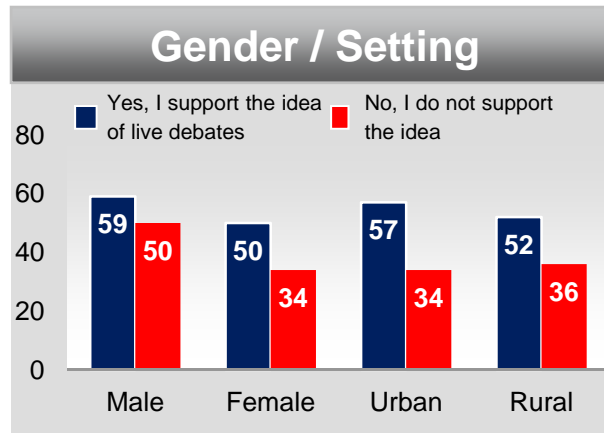
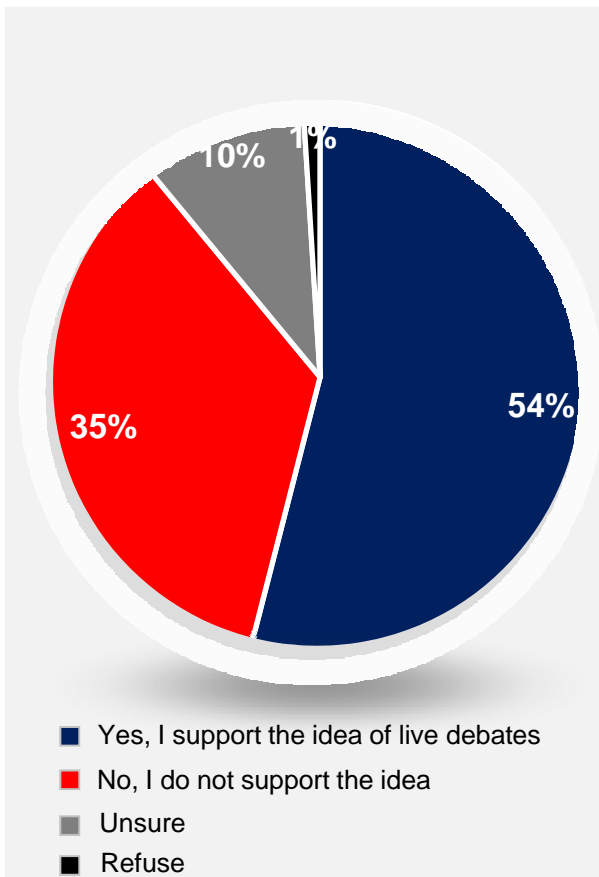
Large majority of young voters support the idea of debate between Najib and Anwar.

Leadership Debate

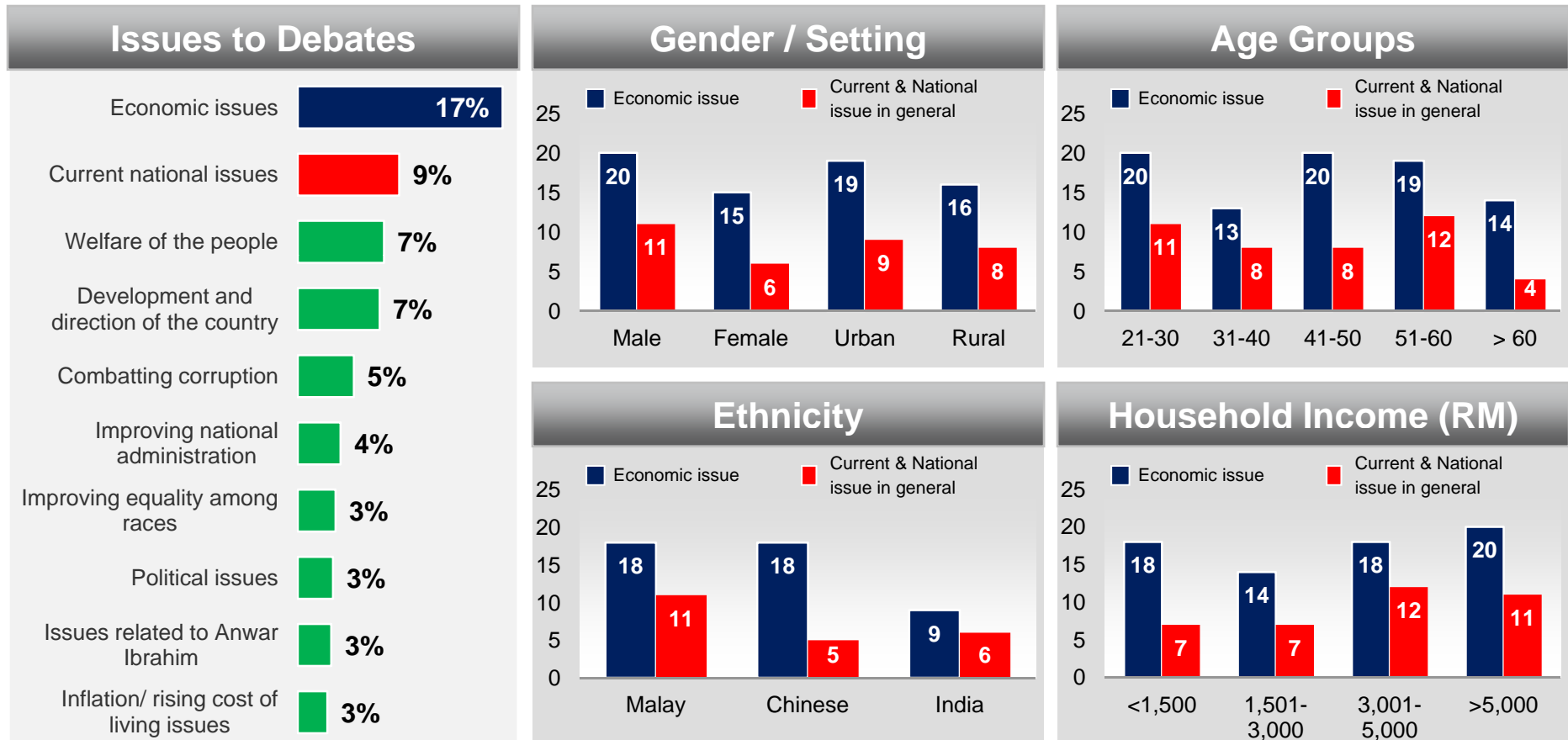
Malay voters only, n=607
