#### Methodology


- 1060 randomly selected registered voters aged 21+ were interviewed via telephone for the survey
- Respondents were selected via random stratified sampling method along the lines of state of residence, ethnicity, gender and age
- Survey was carried out between 19 June 1 July 2009
- Survey margin of error estimated at ±3.01%
- Important events during survey period: Announcement of further economic sector liberalization measures, public discussion of unity govt (and subsequent dismissal of issue by Pakatan/PAS), several schools closed due to A(H1N1) influenza outbreak, indirect campaigning for Manek Urai begins.



Peninsular Malaysia, 19 June – 1 July 2009












How confident or not confident are you that Najib is able to lead Malaysia out of this economic recession?






To what extent do you think you will benefit or will not benefit from the stimulus package?






How strongly are you satisfied or dissatisfied of the way Najib Razak is performing his job as the Prime Minister?






#### In your view, what is the best thing he has done since he became PM?





### In your view, what is the one thing he should have avoided doing since he became PM?




### In your view, what is the most important reform that needs to be done in Malaysia now?






How confident or not confident are you that Najib is able to bring about reforms needed by the country?




Compared to ..., would you say that Najib Razak's performance as PM is better, worse, or about the same?






## How confident or not confident are you in the following government functions with Najib as PM?




The Prime Minister had last month announced a policy to liberalize some aspects of the financial and services sectors. What do you understand by the liberalization policy?






### How confident or not confident are you that this liberalization policy will ...?




How confident or not confident are you that the liberalization of the services sector will bring in more investment and job opportunities?






How confident or not confident are you that this liberalization policy will help Malaysia in the long run?







How confident or not confident are you that this liberalization policy will help the Malays in the long run?




### Are you aware of the concept of One Malaysia introduced by the Prime Minister?




#### What is your understanding of the One Malaysia concept?




How confident or not confident are you that One Malaysia will be able to achieve its goals?




How confident or not confident are you that Najib has what it takes to improve race relations in Malaysia?




How strongly do you agree or disagree with UMNO and PAS having talks on issues concerning Malay and Muslim interest?



How strongly do you agree or disagree with the idea of an UMNO-PAS unity government?




